Updates to Standards:

911 Advisory Committee re-established in Spring 2019 and tasked with full review and updating of standards

STANDARDS UPDATE

Caveat:

Currently the Standards only apply to "Wireless PSAPs" as defined in law (Title 21, Chapter LX, Part 5200)

<u>Committee's Goal:</u> Applies to all PSAPs

GOALS IN UPDATING STANDARDS

- Remove Outdated "Stuff"
- Forward Looking
- Flexible and Scalable
- Vendor Agnostic
- Minimum Standards vs. Unfunded Mandates
- (No Directive from State)

- Definition of a PSAP (Split out Primary vs. Secondary PSAPs)
- Changed "(Phone) Calls" to "Requests for Service"
- Defined Roles (Telecommunicators, Supervisors, Directorlevel Personnel)
- Made ICS Requirements consistent with NIMS/State

- Training
 - Telecommunicators: 200 hours to 240 hours
 - Expanded up the chain (Supervisors, Directors)
 - Trainers have to be CTOs
 - QA/QI have to be certified
 - Directors certify agency compliance
 - Appendix A (Acceptable Training)

- Text-to-911 by January 2021
- NG911
 - Added Z coordinate (Elevation) requirements
 - GIS Stuff
 - Connect with State ESINet (when available)

- Backup Capability
 - Maintain Backup Center "capability"
 - Written COOP Plan
